#### 5 Treasurers Report

#### 6 Environmental Report

Ron is happy with the estate environmental team. Charlie has been talking with Ron and the lady at number three Marshwworth who is now looking after the small beds by the estate entrance.

Aprii thanked all the volunteers who had helped with the flower beds outside Tesco's and asked if we could buy some soil/compost which the meeting approved and Ron asked that a hose be bought and stored at the meeting place for the watering of the flower beds, again the meeting approved.

# 7 Funding Update

April updated the meeting that no funding had been applied for in the last month.

April reported to the meeting that we need to be applying for funding if we want a seaside coach trip also if we want a summer dog show and funday.

The meeting agreed to apply to WCC for grant funding towards the cost of a coach trip to the seaside.

# 8 Seek Approval For Website Hosting.

The meeting was asked to approve the renewal of our Resident's Association website hosting for the next two years at a cost of £70.80, This was approved by the meeting.

# 9 Updates on Renewal MK and RORE Meetings

John updated the meeting on the current situation with regards to Milton Keynes Council's estate renewal project. John outlined that the next stage in the process was to be the setting up of estate renewal forums and that we are waiting to hear more about that process.

RORE is continuing to meet and analyse this process along with the WCC planning and development committee who are scrutinising the MK council's actions.

A wide ranging discussion about the negative effects of the regeneration process so far from the fact that planned maintenance was suspended for council tenants to the suppression of private property values and how private homeowners felt nervous of investing in maintenance of their properties.

#### 10 Community Larder And Cafe Update.

April reported that for the next week the cafe will be closed for a week due to a shortage of volunteers and the week after is he jubilee festival instead. Since April posted on social media four more volunteers have come forward. The social benefit of the cafe was discussed and highlighted that for some of our customers this offers a local opportunity to socialise and take a break from
