8	Kevin Harris – Resident Engagement Officer	
	Kevin spoke about his role and what he does for MK Council. He is there to support the RAs of MK. Works on projects around MK to support residents and the engagement of residents. His team are funded by the housing revenue.	
	If a council resident has a problem with their housing, they should speak to a housing officer in the first instant but they can also speak to the resident's engagement team.	
	John asked what can we do as a resident's association to help the residents engagement function? Kevin advised that we can attend their meeting, the training they offer and keep involved as much as possible. Allowing the team to come to our meetings, making sure our finances are in order, having orderly meetings.	
	Kevin advised that there is an Anti-social behaviour forum, they will cover various points, its at the civic offices on the 31 <sup>st</sup> of May 2023, Deanna & April are already booked into this forum.	
9	Funding Update	
	April advised that we had not applied for any funding, the committee was asked if anyone wanted to do an easter event and apply for funding and no one came forward so noting has been applied for as of yet.	
10	Events	
	The café/Larder are running a Bingo & Curry night on the 7 <sup>th</sup> of April at the meeting place. Times and more details to be confirmed.	
	Jhon mentioned the coach trips, Deanna is getting quotes together for these so we can apply for funding.

11	Environmental Report	
	Ron hasn't updated any issue on the estate. Terry and Derek, has been checking the planters and the verges around the estate and nothing to report at the moment its looking well. The estate over all seems to be well kept, street cleaning and pay back have been on the estate twice. MK Council have found some address's that are dumping on the estate	

and they are looking to take action on this. There is a mattress and a bed base behind the park at the end of Buckby, this has been reported but is still there. The rubbish that was dumped at the back of Colne, the council had found 2 addresses in this mess and are looking into this.

### 12 Café / Fridge / Larder / Warm Room

Ashland & Simpson council asked how many residents attend our days from their estates, April gave them this information and they offered to give us £800 towards the Fridge / Larder to contribute. We have noticed that there are more and more elderly residents coming forward in need but not being able to afford the larder. We have members that pay for an extra membership but put their items forward to help those in need so we distribute as and where we need to. Fridge had the highest number of attendees this week, stock isn't coming in too high but members are rising.

Warm room funding has ended and donations aren't fully covering this, John asked if we can find funding would we like to continue running this. Donna is looking into finding more funding options. We want to avoid charging per person as then if a resident is struggling, they will not come and they will be the ones most in need.

We have agreed to run the Warm room for a further 4 weeks, to review, start to tell people regularly that we are running on donations now and all donations would greatly help us keep running. David Lee kindly offered (with Thanks from the TBRA) to underwrite it (top up) for the next 4 weeks to carry on to see if we can get the donations up, also Donna will look into more funding in the meantime.

We have a lot of vulnerable residents attend, some that we never see around the estate any more so for them to attend it makes us happy knowing we are doing well in the community to get people back together and more involved and looking out for each other.

#### 13 A.O.B.

Dave mentioned the Local Housing Decarbonisation Fund, MK Council put in a big grant, that has been approved, this grant is to help improve the insulation on Tinkers Bridge, there is no when or what exactly this will be just yet. The first stage is approved this is starting in Netherfield. Donna has advised she is sure that Tinkers bridge is in the second stage. All surveys were said to have been done in council houses on TB.

WCC are holding a Woughton wide summer party on the 15<sup>th</sup> of July. Rather than do a stand-alone event, the WCC will go round each estates year to year, all residents' associations are welcomed to have a stall at these events so that all estates are involved.

WCC are also holding a Eurovision party on the 13<sup>th</sup> of May 5pm-10pm, this is being held at Tinkers Bridge, a screen will be showing the Eurovision in the garden and all help from our volunteers will be appreciated.

Kerry discussed that she was told she could no longer volunteer for the Café / Larder / Warm room due to a dispute between herself and April.

John advised as the projects are run and lead by April, she has the final say who can volunteer and she will discuss this and take the opinions of the other volunteers as well. April advised that Kerry can volunteer as part of the RA but not on Café / Larder as she isn't comfortable working with Kerry.
