1	Welcome

- We are running a cat microchip event on TB through the community fridge, we have 38 booked in at present. This will cost the owner £5 per cat.

- 7<sup>th</sup> September, 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday of Woughton, this will be held in Netherfield.

#### 7 February Newsletter

Sian asked what we would like in the February newsletter, Apil said the normal items, fly tipping, dogs mess, use bins provided. Asking residents to reports problems to the RA or someone they feel they can speak to, reports problems to MKCC where necessary. People who walk dogs, please keep them on leads, friendly or not.
